### **Requirements**

ORS 181.592 is amended to read:</p> <p><del>(d)</del> (5) The information required to be <del>made available under paragraph (c) of this subsection</del> posted on the Internet website is:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(A)</del> (a) The person's name and address, as described in ORS 181.598 (1)(a) and (b) ;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(B)</del> (b) A physical description of the person including, but not limited to, the person's age, height, weight and eye and hair color;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(C)</del> (c) The type of vehicle that the person is known to drive;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(D)</del> (d) Any conditions or restrictions upon the person's probation, parole, post-prison supervision or conditional release;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(E)</del> (e) A description of the person's primary and secondary targets;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(F)</del> (f) A list of the sex offenses for which the person has been convicted and a description of the person's method of offense;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(G)</del> (g) A current photograph of the person;</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(H)</del> (h) If the person is under supervision, the name or telephone number of the person's parole and probation officer; and</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;"><del>(I)</del> (i) If the person is not under supervision, contact information for the Department of State Police.</p>

<b>Community Notification and Websites</b>	<i>O.R.S. § 181.592 (West 2008)</i>
	<p>(4)(a):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The department shall make information about a person who is under supervision for the first time as a result of a conviction for an offense that requires reporting as a sex offender accessible only by the use of the sex offender's name.</li> <li>• For all other sex offenders, the department may make the information accessible in any manner the department chooses.</li> </ul> <p>(c) The department shall use the Internet to make the information available to the public if the information is about a person:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(A) Determined to be a predatory sex offender; or</li> <li>(B) Found to be a sexually violent dangerous offender.</li> </ul>
<b>Limitations on Residency or Employment</b>	<i>O.R.S. § 144.642 (West 2008)</i>
	<p>(1)(a) Sex offenders may not reside near locations where children are the primary occupants or users.</p> <p>(1)(c) Unless authorized, sex offenders may not live with other sex offenders.</p>
<b>Duration of Registration</b>	<i>O.R.S. § 181.600 (West 2008)</i>
	(1)(a) A registrant may petition for termination of the registration obligation after 10 years.
