### About Us:

The Southwest Center for Law and Policy (SWCLAP) is a non-profit 501(c) 3 organization based in Tucson, Arizona. Since 2002, SWCLAP has been providing legal training and technical assistance, on a national level, to OVW grantees serving American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) victims of sexual and domestic violence, stalking, elder abuse, teen dating violence, firearms violence, and abuse of persons with disabilities. SWCLAP is funded by the United States Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office on Violence Against Women (OVW) as the national legal training and technical assistance provider for federally recognized Tribes receiving USDOJ funding.

SWCLAP is also the parent organization of the Sexual Assault Forensic Examinations, Services, Training, Access, and Resources (SAFESTAR) program, the National Tribal Trial College (NTTC), and the National Indian Country Clearinghouse on Sexual Assault (NICCSA).

## **Tasks Include but, not limited to:**

- ❖ Developing materials on aspects of Sexual and Domestic Violence committed against American Indian/Alaska Natives for publication and distribution.
- ❖ Legal Research and writing on Sexual and Domestic Violence against American Indian/Alaska Native victims.
- ❖ Assisting with preparation for national conferences on sexual assault and domestic violence against Native peoples.
- ❖ Assist in development (and possible delivery) of curricula on Violence against American Indian/Alaska Native women to Tribes and to Tribal communities across the United States.
- ❖ Providing help with SAFESTAR (i.e. inventory, ordering and shipping materials)
- ❖ Providing information and referrals for Tribal justice, Healthcare, and Advocacy professionals through the National NICCSA toll-free hotline.
