

# ***Adult Sex Offender Registration Requirements***

## ***IOWA***

### **Requirements**

<b>Registrable Offenses</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sexual abuse (1st degree)</li> <li>• Sexual abuse (2nd degree)</li> <li>• Sexual abuse (3rd degree)</li> <li>• Lascivious acts with a child</li> <li>• Assault with intent to commit sexual abuse</li> <li>• Burglary (1st degree)</li> <li>• Kidnapping (if 1st degree sexual abuse committed during the offense)</li> <li>• Murder (if 1st degree sexual abuse committed during the offense)</li> <li>• Criminal transmission of HIV</li> <li>• Kidnapping of a minor (except in the 3rd degree when committed by a parent)</li> <li>• False imprisonment of a minor (except by a parent)</li> <li>• Any indictable offense involving sexual conduct directed toward a minor</li> <li>• Solicitation of a minor to engage in an illegal sex act</li> <li>• Use of a minor in sexual performance</li> <li>• Solicitation of a minor to practice prostitution</li> <li>• Any indictable offense against a minor involving sexual contact with the minor</li> <li>• Incest committed against a minor</li> <li>• Dissemination and exhibition of obscene material to minors</li> <li>• Admitting minors to premises where obscene material is exhibited</li> <li>• Stalking, if sexually motivated</li> <li>• Sexual exploitation of a minor</li> <li>• Enticing away a minor</li> <li>• Telephone dissemination of obscene materials</li> <li>• Rental or sale of hard-core pornography</li> <li>• Indecent exposure</li> <li>• Incest committed against a dependent adult (as defined in 235B.2)</li> <li>• Sexual misconduct with offenders</li> <li>• Murder, attempted murder, kidnapping, burglary or manslaughter if the offense involves sexual abuse or attempted sexual abuse.</li> <li>• Sexual exploitation by counselor, therapist, or school employee</li> </ul> <p>Any attempt to commit one of the offenses listed above.</p>
<b>Information Maintained in Sex Offender Registry</b>	<p><i>I.C.A. § 692A.5 (West 2008)</i></p> <p>(1)(a)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Name</li> <li>• Social security number</li> <li>• Date of birth</li> <li>• Current address</li> <li>• Telephone number</li> <li>• Fingerprints</li> <li>• Photograph</li> <li>• Identifying factors (sexually violent predators only)</li> <li>• Anticipated future places of residence (sexually violent predators only)</li> <li>• Offense history (sexually violent predators only)</li> <li>• Documentation of treatment received for mental abnormality or personality disorder (sexually violent predators only)</li> </ul>

<b>Community Notification and Websites</b>	<i>I.C.A. § 692A.13 (West 2008)</i>
	<p>1. The department may provide relevant information from the sex offender registry to the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. A criminal or juvenile justice agency, an agency of the state, any sex offender registry of another state, or the federal government.</li> <li>b. The general public through the sex offender registry's web page</li> <li>c. The single contact repository.</li> </ol> <p>2. A criminal or juvenile justice agency may provide relevant information from the sex offender registry to the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. A criminal or juvenile justice agency, an agency of the state, or any sex offender registry of another state, or the federal government.</li> <li>b. The general public, including public and private agencies, organizations, public places, child care facilities, religious and youth organizations, neighbors, neighborhood associations, community meetings, and employers. Registry information may be distributed to the public through printed materials, visual or audio press releases, radio communications, or through a criminal or juvenile justice agency's web page.</li> </ol> <p>3. When a person required to register under this chapter moves into a school district or moves within a school district, the county sheriff of the county of the person's new residence shall provide relevant information from the sex offender registry to the administrative office of the school district in which the person required to register resides, and shall also provide relevant information to any private school near the person's residence.</p> <p>4. Any member of the public may contact a county sheriff's office or police department to request relevant information from the registry regarding a specific person required to register under this chapter.</p> <p>5. A county sheriff shall also provide to any person upon request access to a list of all registrants in that county.</p>
<b>Limitations on Residency or Employment</b>	<i>I.C.A. § 692A.2A (West 2008)</i>
	<p>1.5 Construction and application:</p> <p>Any person who has committed a criminal offense against a minor, or aggravated offense, sexually violent offense, or other relevant offense that involves a minor may not reside within 2000 feet of an elementary or secondary school or childcare facility.</p> <p>A sex offender who resided within 2000 feet of a school prior to July 1, 2002 is not required to move or sell their residence.</p>
<b>Duration of Registration</b>	<i>I.C.A. § 692A.4A (West 2008)</i>
	<p>Sex offenders are subject to registration for 10 years.</p> <p>Persons that have committed a criminal offense against a minor, aggravated offense, sexually violent offense, or other relevant offense that involved a minor will be supervised for at least 5 years by an electronic tracking and monitoring system in addition to any other conditions of release.</p>
