Requirements

Registrable Offenses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unlawful imprisonment, if the victim is under 18 and the offender is not the victim's parent. • Kidnapping, if the victim is under 18 and the offender is not the victim's parent. • Sexual abuse, if the victim is under 18 • Sexual conduct with a minor • Sexual assault • Molestation of a child • Continuous sexual abuse of a child • Taking a child for the purpose of prostitution • Child prostitution • Commercial sexual exploitation of a minor • Sexual exploitation of a minor • Luring a minor for sexual exploitation • Aggravated luring a minor for sexual exploitation • Sex trafficking of a minor • A 2nd or subsequent conviction of Indecent exposure if victim was under 15 • A 2nd or subsequent conviction of Public sexual indecency if victim was under 15 • A 3rd or subsequent conviction of indecent exposure • A 3rd or subsequent conviction of public sexually indecency • Failure of registered offender to notify of a change of residence • Failure of a person subject to registration to register as a sex offender - ARIZ. REV. STAT. ANN. § 13- 3824 (West 2008). <p>In addition, the court may require any person convicted of any sex offense or of child sexual exploitation to register if there was a finding of sexual motivation</p>
Information Maintained in Sex Offender Registry	<p><i>ARIZ. REV. STAT. 13 § 3821 (West 2008).</i></p> <p>(H):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Name • Physical location and address of the offender’s residence • Name of the owner of the offender’s residence • Location and number of any post office boxes used by the offender • All aliases • Fingerprints • Photograph of offender • Enrollment or employment status at a public or private institution of postsecondary education (if applicable)
Community Notification and Websites	<p><i>A.R.S. 13 § 3825 (West 2008).</i></p> <p>(A):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Within seventy-two hours after a person who was convicted as a sex offender shall provide all of the following information to the department of public safety by entering all of the following information into the sex offender profile and notification database: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The offender's identifying information. ○ A risk assessment of the offender. ○ The offender's date of release from confinement or, if the offender is sentenced to probation without jail time, the date the sentence is imposed. <p>(B). The information from subsection A is then forwarded to the sheriff in the county where the person is registered.</p>

	<p>(C). After receiving the information pursuant to subsection B of this section, the sheriff shall forward the information to the chief law enforcement officer of the community in which the person resides.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After reviewing the information received and any other information available to the local law enforcement agency, the local law enforcement agency shall categorize each offender and place each offender into a notification level. • Within forty-five days, the local law enforcement agency shall notify the community of the offender's presence in the community pursuant to the guidelines established by the community notification guidelines committee. • If the community does not have a chief law enforcement officer, the sheriff shall perform the duties of the local law enforcement agency.
Limitations on Residency or Employment	None.
Duration of Registration	<p><i>A.R.S. 13 § 3821 (West 2008).</i></p> <p>(M) 10 years for persons convicted for a single offense of unlawful imprisonment or kidnapping of a minor. Life for persons with prior convictions for any registrable offense.</p>
