### Requirements

<b>Registrable Offenses</b>	<p>A conviction for one of the following offenses or for an attempt or solicitation of one of the following offenses if the victim was less than 18 years of age at the time of the criminal conduct:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Unlawful sexual contact</li> <li>• Visual sexual aggression against child</li> <li>• Sexual misconduct with a child under 14 years of age</li> <li>• Sexual exploitation of minor</li> <li>• Dissemination of sexually explicit material</li> <li>• Possession of sexually explicit material</li> <li>• Kidnapping (unless actor is a parent of the victim)</li> <li>• Criminal restraint (unless actor is a parent of the victim)</li> <li>• Violation of</li> <li>• Incest</li> <li>• Aggravated promotion of prostitution</li> <li>• Patronizing prostitution of a minor</li> <li>• Sexual abuse of minors</li> <li>• Gross sexual assault</li> <li>• Gross sexual assault</li> </ul>
<b>Information Maintained in Sex Offender Registry</b>	<p><i>34-A M.R.S.A. § 11221 (Wet 2008)</i></p> <p>1. Maintenance of registry. The bureau shall establish and maintain a registry of persons required to register pursuant to this subchapter. The registry must include the following information on each registrant:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>A. The registrant's name, aliases, date of birth, sex, race, height, weight, eye color, mailing address and physical location of expected domicile and residence;</li> <li>B. Place of employment and college or school being attended, if applicable, and the corresponding address and location;</li> <li>C. Offense history;</li> <li>D. Notation of any treatment received for a mental abnormality or personality disorder;</li> <li>E. A photograph and set of fingerprints;</li> <li>F. A description of the offense for which the registrant was convicted, the date of conviction and the sentence imposed; and</li> <li>G. Any other information the bureau determines important.</li> </ul>
<b>Community Notification and Websites</b>	<p><i>34-A M.R.S.A. § 11221 (West 2008)</i></p> <p>9. PUBLIC ACCESS TO INFORMATION. A. The bureau shall post on the Internet for public inspection information concerning a registrant.</p> <p>12. LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY WEBSITE. A law enforcement agency may maintain its own sex offender website and may make that information available for use by the public.</p> <p><i>34-A M.R.S.A. § 11255 (West 2008)</i></p> <p>1. DEPARTMENT. Upon the conditional release or discharge of a registrant from a state correctional institution, the department shall give notice to members of the public the department determines appropriate to ensure public safety.</p> <p>2. LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES. Upon receipt of the information concerning the conditional release or discharge of a registrant, a law enforcement agency shall notify members of a municipality that the law enforcement agency determines appropriate to ensure public safety.</p>

<b>Duration of Registration</b>	<i>34-A M.R.S.A. §§ 11225-A (West 2008)</i>
	10 years for sex offenders not subject to lifetime registration.
	<i>34-A M.R.S.A. § 11203 (West 2008)</i>
	Life for persons convicted of sexually violent offenses or for registrants with prior sex offense convictions.
