

# **Adult Sex Offender Registration Requirements**

## **CONNECTICUT**

### **Requirements**

**Registrable Offenses**

*Criminal Offense Against a Victim Who is a Minor:*

- Having contact with the intimate parts of a minor under 16 or subjecting a minor under 16 to contact with the intimate parts of such person in a sexual and indecent manner likely to impair the health or morals of such child
- Sexual assault (1st degree) of a person under 13 years of age when the offender is at least two years older than the victim
- Sexual assault (2nd degree) when the victim is:
  - (1) Between the ages of 13 and 16, and the offender is at least 2 years older than the victim;
  - (2) Less than 18 years old and the actor is the victim's guardian or is otherwise responsible for the general supervision of the victim's welfare; or
  - (3) The actor is a school employee and the victim is a student enrolled in a school in which the actor works or a school under the jurisdiction of the local or regional board that employs the actor
- Sexual assault (3rd degree) when the actor engages in sexual intercourse with another person whom the actor knows to be related to him or her within specified degrees of kindred
- Promoting prostitution (1st degree) when the offender advances or profits from the prostitution of a person less than 16 years old
- Promoting prostitution (2nd degree) when the offender advances or profits from the prostitution of a person less than 18 years old
- Enticing a minor
- Employing a minor in an obscene performance
- Promoting a minor in an obscene performance
- Importing child pornography
- Possessing child pornography (1st degree)
- Possessing child pornography (2nd degree)
- Possessing child pornography (3rd degree)
- Kidnapping (1st degree) of a victim under the age of 18
- Kidnapping (1st degree with a firearm) of a victim under the age of 18
- Kidnapping (2nd degree) of a victim under the age of 18
- (2nd degree with a firearm) of a victim under the age of 18
- Unlawful restraint (1st degree) of a victim under the age of 18
- Unlawful restraint (2nd degree) of a victim under the age of 18
- Public indecency involving a victim under the age of 18
- Committing an offense listed above for which a person can be criminally liable for the acts of another, or the attempt or conspiracy to commit one of the crimes listed above.

*Sexually Violent Offenses:*

- Sexual assault (1st degree), except when the victim is under the age of 13 and the offender is at least two years older than the victim.
- Sexual assault in spousal or cohabiting relationship
- Sexual assault (2nd degree)
- Sexual assault (3rd degree)
- Kidnapping (1st degree), provided the court makes a finding that the offense was committed with the intent to sexually violate or abuse the victim.
- Kidnapping (1st degree with a firearm), provided the court makes a finding that the offense was committed with the intent to sexually violate or abuse the victim.

Committing an offense listed above for which a person can be criminally liable for the acts of another, or the attempt or conspiracy to commit one of the crimes listed above

	<p>(a)(1):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The registry maintained by the Department of Public Safety shall be a public record and shall be accessible to the public during normal business hours.</li> <li>• The Department of Public Safety shall make registry information available to the public through the Internet.</li> <li>• Not less than once per calendar quarter, the Department of Public Safety shall issue notices to all print and electronic media in the state regarding the availability and means of accessing the registry.</li> <li>• Each local police department and each state police troop shall keep a record of all registration information transmitted to it by the Department of Public Safety, and shall make such information accessible to the public during normal business hours.</li> </ul> <p>(a)(2): Any state agency, the Judicial Department, any state police troop or any local police department may, at its discretion, notify any government agency, private organization or individual of registration information when such agency, said department, such troop or such local police department, as the case may be, believes such notification is necessary to protect the public or any individual in any jurisdiction from any person who is subject to registration.</p>
<b>Limitations on Residency or Employment</b>	None.
<b>Duration of Registration</b>	<i>C.G.S.A. § 54-252(a)</i>
	Life for persons convicted of sexually violent offenses.
	<i>C.G.S.A. § 54-251(a)</i>
	10 years for persons convicted of a criminal offense against a minor or a nonviolent sexual offense, unless the offender has a prior conviction for any such offense, in which case registration is for life.
	<i>C.G.S.A. § 54-254(a)</i>
	10 years for persons convicted of a felony, which the court finds was committed for a sexual purpose.
