Requirements

Registrable Offenses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accosting, enticing or soliciting child for immoral purpose • Accosting, enticing or soliciting child for immoral purpose; prior conviction • Child sexually abusive activity or material; possession of child sexually abusive material • Crime against nature or sodomy (if the victim is under 18) • Indecent exposure (if that individual was previously convicted of indecent exposure) • A third or subsequent violation of any combination of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Indecent or obscene conduct in a public place ○ Indecent exposure ○ A local ordinance of a municipality substantially corresponding to a section described above. • Gross indecency; between male persons (where the victim is under 18, except for a juvenile disposition or adjudication) • Gross indecency; female persons (where the victim is under 18, except for a juvenile disposition or adjudication) • Gross indecency; between male and female persons (where the victim is under 18, except for a juvenile disposition or adjudication) • Kidnapping (if the victim is less than 18 years of age) • Leading, taking, carrying away, decoying, or enticing away child under 14 • Soliciting, accosting, or inviting to commit prostitution or immoral act (if the victim is less than 18 years of age) • Pandering • Criminal sexual conduct in the first degree • Criminal sexual conduct in the second degree • Criminal sexual conduct in the third degree • Criminal sexual conduct in the fourth degree • Assault with intent to commit criminal sexual conduct • Any other violation of a law of this state or a local ordinance of a municipality that by its nature constitutes a sexual offense against an individual who is less than 18 years of age. • An offense committed by a person who was, at the time of the offense, a sexually delinquent person as defined in section 10a of the Michigan penal code. • An attempt or conspiracy to commit an offense described. • An offense substantially similar to an offense listed above under a law of the United States, any state, or any country or under tribal or military law. • An individual from another state who is required to register or otherwise be identified as a sex or child offender or predator under a comparable statute of that state.
Information Maintained in Sex Offender Registry	<p><i>M.C.L.A. § 28.727 (West 2008)</i></p> <p>§7(1)(a) The individual's name, social security number, date of birth, and address or expected address. An individual who is in a witness protection and relocation program is only required to use the name and identifying information reflecting his or her new identity in a registration under this act. The registration and compilation databases shall not contain any information identifying the individual's prior identity or locale. The department shall request each individual to provide his or her date of birth if it is not included in the registration, and that individual shall comply with the request within 10 days.</p> <p>(b) A brief summary of the individual's convictions for listed offenses regardless of when the conviction occurred, including where the offense occurred and the original charge if the conviction was for a lesser offense.</p> <p>(c) A complete physical description of the individual.</p> <p>(d) The photograph required under section 5.</p> <p>(e) The individual's fingerprints if not already on file with the department.</p>

Community Notification and Websites	<i>M.C.L.A. § 28.730 (West 2008)</i>
	<p>(2): A department post, local law enforcement agency, or sheriff's department shall make information for the zip code areas located in whole or in part within the post's, agencies, or sheriff's department's jurisdiction available for public inspection during regular business hours.</p> <p>(3):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The department may make information available to the public through electronic, computerized, or other accessible means. • The department shall provide for notification by electronic or computerized means to any member of the public who has subscribed in a manner required by the department when an individual initially registers under this act, or changes his or her registration under this act, to a location that is in a zip code area designated by the subscribing member of the public.

	<p>(2) The department shall maintain a computerized database that consists of a compilation of individuals registered under this act.</p> <p>(6):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The department shall make the compilation or information from the compilation available to a department post, local law enforcement agency, sheriff's department, and the public by electronic, computerized, or other similar means accessible to the post, agency, or sheriff's department. • The electronic, computerized, or other similar means shall provide for both a search by name and by zip code.
Limitations on Residency or Employment	<i>M.C.L.A. §§ 28.733 & 27.734 (West 2008)</i>
	Sex offenders may not work or loiter within a student safety zone
Duration of Registration	<i>M.C.L.A. § 28.725 (West 2008)</i>
	<p>§ 5</p> <p>(7) 25 years from the date of initially registering or 10 years after release from incarceration, whichever is longer, for registrants not subject to lifetime registration.</p> <p>(8) Life for registrants convicted of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First degree criminal sexual conduct; • Second degree criminal sexual conduct with person under 13; • Kidnapping a minor; • Enticing a child under 14; • Persuading, inducing, enticing, coercing, causing, or knowingly allowing a child to engage in a child sexually abusive activity for the purpose of producing any child sexually abusive material; or • A second or subsequent registrable offense.
